We are a network of volunteer organizations in Clermont County Ohio that help citizens prepare for and respond to natural and man made disasters, including threats of terrorism.

Community Emergency Response Team

CERT trains people in neighborhoods, workplace, and schools in basic disaster response skills, such as fire suppression, search and rescue, and medical operations, and helps them take a more active role in emergency preparedness.



Medical Reserve Corps

MRC coordinates citizens and teams of local volunteer medical and public health professionals to contribute their skills and expertise throughout the year and during times of community need.



Volunteer Reception Center

VRC registers, trains and assigns duties to the spontaneous and unaffiliated volunteers that come to help in a disaster response.



County Animal Response Team

CART ensures all animals are considered and cared for before, during and after any natural or man-made disaster in the tristate. This is done by coordinating, educating, and training volunteers.



Volunteer In Police Service

VIPS works to enhance the capacity of state and local law enforcement by training and utilizing volunteers.



Neighborhood Watch Program

NWP incorporates terrorism education into its existing crime prevention mission and serves as a way to bring residents together to train and focus on protecting their communities.



Fire Corps

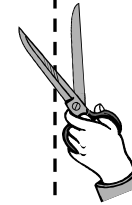
FC works to increase the capacity of volunteer, career and combination fire and EMS departments through the use of citizen advocates to support department programs.
