## *Register Today*

## MEDICAL RESERVE CORPS VOLUNTEERS SERVE TO:

- **Support** the Surgeon General's priority of enhancing public health preparedness.
- **Train** with health department personnel and local emergency response partners.
- **Participate** in community preparedness activities, such as exercises to set up medication dispensing sites, and other emergency scenarios.
- **Assist** health departments and other agencies in times of disaster or community emergencies.

## Tristate Medical Reserve Corps

Volunteers may be activated to assist a local community, health department, or other agency during an emergency.

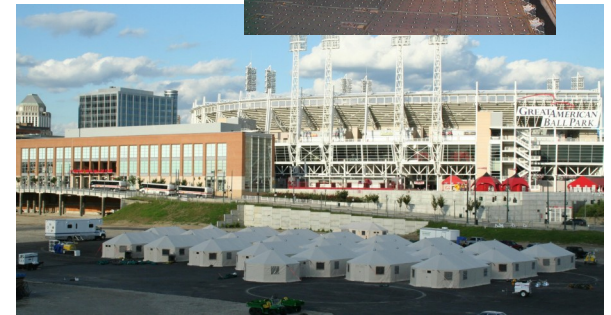
Volunteers may also be activated to respond to a national emergency.

In a public health emergency, volunteer responses may include:

- The receipt and distribution of emergency medical supplies
- The setup and operation of mass medication dispensing or mass vaccination sites
- The setup and operation of triage, medical screening, and alternative care centers
- Assist in the operation of shelters during disasters.
- Providing emergency public information to our communities

## VOLUNTEERS SOUGHT

Physicians, nurses, pharmacists, dentists, psychologists, EMTs, paramedics, veterinarians, chiropractors, medical office staff, social services personnel, and many others will fill key medical positions.



Personnel will also be needed to perform supportive roles such as logistics, supply inventory, documentation and record keeping, security, traffic control, site preparation, and more.
